Elected officials urge regulation of marijuana like alcohol

A growing number of Iowa elected officials publicly support regulating marijuana like Iowa regulates alcohol for adult use. The names of 39 state and local elected officials (below) who support this reform were released at a news conference on Wednesday, January 6.

"It's time to reform Iowa's outdated marijuana laws," said **Iowa City Mayor Bruce Teague.** "Laws that regulate the adult use of marijuana in a way similar to Iowa's alcohol laws will make our state a better, freer, more just place to live."

The growing support from Iowa legislators and local elected officials for reforming Iowa's marijuana laws follows an increase in support from Iowans generally. A March 2020 Iowa Poll found that a majority of (53 percent) of Iowans support legalization.*

"Iowa's laws criminalizing the possession of small amounts of marijuana are irrational and inconsistently enforced, and a conviction or even an arrest carry numerous direct and collateral consequences that are far out of proportion to the alleged criminal conduct," said **State Representative Mary Wolfe** (D) Clinton.

Fifteen states, home to one out of three Americans currently allow adults to legally use marijuana. Last November, voters in South Dakota legalized the adult use of marijuana. Illinois, another lowa neighbor, legalized marijuana for adults last year.

"Iowa taxpayers currently spend millions of dollars a year to punish adults for marijuana use. These efforts are strongly biased against Iowans of color are and must be reformed," said **State Representative Ross Wilburn** (D) Ames. A 2019 study by the ACLU found that while Black Iowans use marijuana at the same rate as White Iowans, they are more than 7 times more likely to be arrested for marijuana possession. **

"The facts are that marijuana is less toxic and less addictive than alcohol," said **State Senator Jackie Smith**, (D) Sioux City. "States that legalized the adult use of marijuana have created thousands of jobs and have refocused law enforcement resources on more serious problems." "Iowa should do the same."
